CALIFORNIA AIR RESOURCES BOARD (3900) 2022 SERIES D, LEASE REVENUE BONDS SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA HEADQUARTERS – MARY D. NICHOLS CAMPUS GREEN BONDS – CLIMATE BOND CERTIFIED RIVERSIDE COUNTY

Consider adoption of a resolution to:

- 1) Authorize the sale of the State Public Works Board lease revenue bonds to finance and refinance the costs of the construction related to the above described project for the California Air Resources Board.
- 2) Approve the form of various documents related to, and approve and authorize other related actions in connection with, the authorization, issuance, sale, and delivery of said lease revenue bonds.

STAFF ANALYSIS ITEM—1

California Air Resources Board (3900) 2022 Series D, Lease Revenue Bonds Southern California Headquarters – Mary D. Nichols Campus Green Bonds – Climate Bond Certified Riverside County

Action Requested

If approved, the requested action would authorize the sale of the 2022 Series D lease revenue bonds and approve the form of various documents related to, and approve and authorize other related actions in connection with, the issuance, sale, and delivery of said revenue bonds.

<u>Background</u>

The Budget Act of 2017 authorized the Board to issue bonds to fund the construction of the California Air Resources Board Southern California Consolidation Project in Riverside County.

The project has been designated by the Climate Bond Standards Board, on behalf of the Climate Board Initiative, as "Green Bonds – Climate Bond Certified", and a Preissuance certification was provided to the Board on Monday, March 7, 2022.

Concurrent with the issuance of the bonds, the department will enter into site leases with the Board for their project, under which the Board will lease the site at which the project is located from the department. The Board will lease the facility to the department. The rental payments under these facility leases secure the payment of the principal and interest on the Board's bonds. The bonds are scheduled to be fully paid and the lease for the department are scheduled to terminate in 25 years.

The 2022 Series D bonds will be sold through a competitive sale on the basis described in the Notice of Sale.

<u>Project</u>

California Air Resources Board Southern California Headquarters – Mary D. Nichols Campus (Nichols Campus Project) sits on approximately 19 acres of land and includes approximately 402,000 square feet of interior space optimized for a variety of purposes. The campus facilities also house light- and medium-duty emission test cells (rooms/labs), including light-duty, all-terrain vehicle, small off-road engine and three heavy-duty emission test cells, research cells, heavy-duty chassis cells, heavy-duty engine cells and two motorcycle emission test cells, with additional space for creating new testing methods. In addition, the Nichols Campus Project includes multiple fully outfitted chemistry laboratories, and a formal reception area, media center and 250-person auditorium. The Nichols Campus Project includes 120 charging stations for electric vehicles, with infrastructure in place to add more chargers, if needed, and 28 bike lockers.

The Nichols Campus Project also includes a 3.75 megawatt system of rooftop and canopy supported photovoltaic panels with a 1.5 megawatt hour battery storage capacity, rainwater management, heat and light pollution island reductions, outdoor and indoor water use reductions, optimized energy performance, green power and carbon offsets, building life cycle impact reduction, low emitting materials, enhanced indoor air quality strategies and construction and waste management planning.

The Nichols Campus Project is expected to be available for occupancy on or before June 1, 2022.

The Nichols Campus Project is more specifically described in Appendix B of the Preliminary Official Statement.

Staff Recommendation:
