CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, STATE SPECIAL SCHOOLS (6100) CALIFORNIA SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF-RIVERSIDE: REMOVE MODULAR BUILDINGS RIVERSIDE COUNTY

Authority: 2021 Budget Act, 6100-301-0001 (2) as reappropriated and partially reverted by the 2022 Budget Act. 2022 Budget Act, 6100-301-0001 (2)

- 2) An augmentation.

STAFF ANALYSIS ITEM—1

Department of Education, State Special Schools California School for the Deaf-Riverside: Remove Modular Buildings Riverside County

Action Requested

If approved, the requested action will approve preliminary plans and an augmentation.

Scope Description

This project is within scope. This project consists of the demolition of 16 modular buildings at the school, along with remediation of contaminated soil, removal of utility connections, and placement of sod and irrigation at the site previously occupied by the modular buildings.

Funding and Cost Verification

This project is not within cost. The 2021 Budget Act provided \$148,000 General Fund (GF) for preliminary plans, and \$132,000 GF for working drawings. The 2022 Budget Act provided \$1,744,000 GF for construction for total project funding of \$2,024,000. Total estimated project costs are currently \$4,419,000 GF, an increase of \$2,395,000 (\$43,000 for the working drawing phase, \$2,352,000 for the construction phase). The California Department of Education requests an augmentation of \$43,000 for working drawings (2.1 percent of the original project appropriation, 2.1 percent cumulative) and additional authority to fully fund the construction phase is requested for inclusion in the 2023 Budget Act.

Drivers of the cost increase include more extensive hazardous materials abatement, soil remediation, and underground utility removal than initially anticipated.

On March 24, 2023, the Department of Finance notified the chairs of the Joint Legislative Budget Committee and fiscal committees in each house of its intent to recommend the Board approve preliminary plans with an anticipated deficit no sooner than 20 days from that date.

The Department of General Services, on behalf of CDE, shall complete a Summary of Conditions Letter for this project as part of the Riverside: Athletic Complex Replacement and Expansion project, which encompasses the footprint of this project. Completion of real estate due diligence is necessary prior to proceeding to bid.

CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, STATE SPECIAL SCHOOLS (6100) FREMONT SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF: MIDDLE SCHOOL ACTIVITY CENTER ALAMEDA COUNTY

Authority: 2016 Budget Act, Item 6100-301-0001(1) 2021 Budget Act, Item 6100-301-0001(3)

Consider approving an augmentation.

STAFF ANALYSIS ITEM—2

California Department of Education, State Special Schools Fremont School for the Deaf: Middle School Activity Center Alameda County

<u>Action Requested</u> If approved, the requested action will approve an augmentation.

Scope Description

This project is within scope. This project includes replacing an existing modular structure with a permanent 2,160-square-foot building designed to meet the school's needs and conform with state guidelines. The new facility will function as an activity center for approximately 120-150 middle school students (80 residential students who live on campus, 40-day students, and 10-30 special needs students). The center includes a snack bar and space for games, media, and after-school gatherings.

Funding and Project Cost Verification

This project is not within cost. The 2016 Budget Act authorized \$266,000 (\$70,000 for preliminary plans and \$196,000 for working drawings) General Fund (GF), and the 2021 Budget Act included \$2,463,000 GF for construction. Previously, the working drawings phase was augmented by \$120,000, and the construction phase was augmented by \$193,000 to award the construction contract. The current project is estimated to cost

\$3,701,000 GF, an increase of \$659,000. Of this shortfall, the California Department of Education, State Special Schools Division (CDE-SSS) requests an augmentation of \$97,000 (3.6 percent of project appropriations, 15 percent cumulative) to ensure adequate funding through the end of the fiscal year. The remaining \$562,000 is requested for inclusion in the 2023 Budget Act.

The increased construction costs are a result delays related to poor weather, additional sitework to cap a high gas pressure line and install a fire water shut-off valve, and Department of Justice authorization to work in a K-12 environment.

On March 24, 2023, the Department of Finance notified the chairs of the Joint Legislative Budget and fiscal committees in each house of its intent to recommend the Board approve the augmentation no sooner than 20 days from that date.

- \$3,042,000 Project costs previously allocated: \$70,000 for preliminary plans and \$316,000 for working drawings and \$2,656,000 for construction (\$1,975,000 contract, \$99,000 contingency, \$357,000 A&E, \$222,000 other project costs, and \$3,000 agency retained items)
 - \$97,000 Requested augmentation to be allocated: \$97,000 for construction
 - \$562,000 Requested supplemental appropriation to be allocated: \$562,000 for construction

<u>CEQA</u>

The California Department of Education (CDE) filed a Notice of Exemption with the State Clearinghouse on November 1, 2016, and the 35-day statute of limitations expired without challenge.

Real Estate Due Diligence

The Department of General Services, on behalf of the CDE, completed a Summary of Conditions Letter for this project on April 11, 2017, and no issues that would adversely affect the beneficial use and enjoyment of the project were identified.
